Low Traffic Neighbourhoods



Living Streets defines low traffic neighbourhoods as "groups of residential streets, bordered by main or 'distributor' roads (the places where buses, lorries, non-local traffic should be), where 'through' motor vehicle traffic is discouraged or removed." There are different ways to make an LTN, but the main principle is that every resident can drive onto their street, get deliveries etc., but it's harder or impossible to drive straight through from one main road to the next.

Bath & North East Somerset Council is asking for views on a raft of longer-term transport improvements, some of which could be introduced on an experimental basis, including allocating additional road space to improve cycling and walking for daily commuting and better signage across the area

The council is launching a new Liveable Neighbourhoods website for residents to share views on where we can create more space for walking and cycling. The site

Rush Hill Steering Group

The future of the currently closed school site on Rush Hill is finally being reviewed. During May we had the initial meeting of a steering group, which is a group of people to look at all the possible options for the future of the whole site.

We are now looking at what could possibly occupy the site in the future and be sustainable for the longer term. A full consultation will be carried out to ensure what happens will cater for the needs of the majority of people in our area.
