Bath City Farm new Cafe



It is great to see a new Cafe will be opening at Bath City Farm on 9th May 2022.

The search for funding started in 2016 and to date has raised over £500,000 to pay for the building and fit out. Whilst COVID delayed the build initially, construction started in September 2021

The inside of the cafe has space for up to 40 customers whilst outside there are two terraces with far-reaching views across the city of Bath and over the children's play area.

This has been made possible with funding from St John's Foundation, Bath & North East Somerset Council Community Infrastructure Levy, the Power to Change Community Business Fund, Enovert, Bath Disability Trust and Bath and West Community Energy.

Local Councillors Tim Ball and Sarah Moore are delighted that this Cafe will now be in place and will be a valuable asset for the Local Community.

Councillor Tim Ball said "I remember in my early days as a Councillor this idea of a community farm was just a dream of a number of local residents. I am delighted how far this has come over the past 30 years and thank all those involved over the years".

From the outset the cafe will be open Tuesday to Friday from 9am to 4.30pm serving breakfast, lunch, coffee and cake.

EV Charging points

A paper on EV charging will be brought to a Cabinet meeting shortly that will set a clear agreement about the way forward on on-street charging – including a proposal for getting a network of onstreet charging points installed. The council will be doing that as quickly as possible in the coming months and, once agreed, they can procure a private supplier to develop the network.



In the meantime, a range of very fast chargers have been installed in public car parks and a new set of these will be launched shortly when they are connected to the grid.

Bath World Heritage Centre

The new Bath World Heritage Centre will open to the public on Monday 9 May, celebrating Bath's unique cultural offering as a UNESCO World Heritage Site and giving an insight into what makes the city so special.

As a World Heritage Site, Bath sits alongside places like the Taj Mahal and the Great Wall of China as one of the greatest cultural sites in the world. The city recently gained a second listing as one of the 'Great Spa Towns of Europe' and is the only UK city to appear twice on the World Heritage List.

Supported by The National Lottery Heritage Fund, the World Heritage Centre will be a springboard for visitors to Bath and local people to engage with the city's culture, history and heritage and explore popular Bath landmarks as well as lesser-known places around the city. Once established the Centre will attract 100,000 visitors per year.

The Centre will feature a host of interactive exhibits and displays designed to inspire, excite and inform. Friendly and knowledgeable staff and volunteers will be on hand to answer questions and help people make the most of their visit. There will be free walking trails and guides to help visitors to the city explore all it has to offer.

Located in York Street, the World Heritage Centre will be open Monday to Sunday and will be free to enter.
