


Traffic Survey Update



The results have now been produced following the traffic monitoring on Shophouse Road and the High Street. The volume and speed were recorded in 3 locations on these roads over the course of a week.

These results have shown that there is only 1 area of significant concern, which is the section of Shophouse Road near the junction with Innox Road. We are now awaiting the Highway Engineer's assessment of what interventions are possible in this area to share with the residents

Councillors Sarah Moore and Tim Ball will continue to campaign for improvements on roads across the ward and will look at other roads across our area that would benefit from reduction in traffic speeds. The next roads to be reviewed will be Newton Road and Poolemead Road and we are hopeful we can get them added to the list for the next round of reviews.
